# All Saints 1 November 2009 Saint Luke Church, Whitestone, N.Y.



There is a variety of gifts but always the same spirit; there are all sorts of services to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people; it is the same God who is working in all of them. (1 Cor 12)

As we celebrate this weekend the Feast of All Saints (November 1) and All Souls (November 2) St. Paul reminds us of the unity and diversity of the Body of Christ - a unity and diversity which we celebrate as a "communion of saints".

"Just as a human body, though it is made of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In one spirit we were all baptized, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one spirit was given to us all to drink."

As stewards of God's many gifts the parish is enriched by the sharing of our individual gifts of time and talent in service to the Body of Christ which is the church - universal and local. It is the willingness to share our gifts generously that make Saint Luke such a special community of grace and blessing. Paul challenges us to rejoice in our gifts and yet to offer them together in service. No one person is the Body of Christ; yet each person is a part of Christ's Body. Only together can the Body of Christ serve as an instrument of grace and reconciliation.

Allow me to express my thankfulness to all who volunteer their time and talent to build up the Body of Christ here in our parish. Too numerous to list I offer my gratitude and promise of prayers to all who make real these words of Saint Paul in service to the parish and beyond. Together we are truly the presence of Christ here in Whitestone. As St. Paul wrote:

"I think of you; and every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present."

(Philippians 1:3)
