Today's Solemnity of Christ the King brings to a close the liturgical year. Next week the church begins the Season of Advent and a new liturgical year. For many Advent is four weeks of preparation for the celebration of Christmas. Yet how can we prepare to celebrate an event that already has taken place? While we can - and do - rejoice in so great a gift of our savior - Christ will not be born again in the stable of Bethlehem this Christmas morning. What then does Advent prepare us to celebrate?

Advent is about the present and future as well as about the past. The Opening Prayer asks that we prepare to welcome Christ as He comes to us each day and in the future. How? By increasing our strength for doing good!

The scripture readings of Advent as well as the prayers call us to rejoice in the incarnation of Christ that first Christmas and even more importantly to remember that the Lord comes to us now and will come again in glory at the end of the world.

When I was a boy I remember a holy card that made a great impression on me. It was a picture of Jesus knocking at a door - a big wooden door. Yet upon closer look you noticed something unusual. The door had no handle. The message was clear: Christ knocks at the door of our hearts - will we open the door and give Him welcome into our lives? Christ cannot enter if we do not open ourselves to His love. Simple, yet expressive of the Advent season. It is a season of beauty and joy as we prepare our hearts to be attentive to the Lord's knock so that we may be ready to let him into our hearts. But that is not the end. Having been filled with the love of Jesus Christmas calls us to share the gift of Jesus' love with others by the service and goodness of our lives.

Let us make good use of the weeks of Advent. Many opportunities for spiritual growth are being offered by the parish. I invite you to take advantage of these events.




CONGRATULATIONS ----

- 3. Blessing of the Infant Jesus.


