Third Sunday of Advent

Today, the Third Sunday of Advent, is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday so called from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon. Gaudete translated from the Latin means Rejoice and thus sets a tone of joyful expectation for the Lord's birth and Second Coming as does the rose - colored vestments worn by the priest.

As Christmas draws near the church urges us to practice the Christian virtue of joy. Yes, joy should truly be a basic characteristic of every Christian and of the church. Yet often we Christians seem so sad and tired from the many pressures, problems and worries of life. Often I am afraid our faith seems less than joyful and more of a burden reduced to mere do's and don'ts.

What then is the cause of our joy? Does that mean there are no problems, anxieties or sufferings for the Christian? Are we Christians blind to the pain and hunger of the human family? Of course not!

The cause of our joy is Christ - whose coming in the flesh is the birth of our hope. The cause of our Christian joy is the hope found in our salvation in Christ. In the midst of human life with all its darkness, we live in the joy of Christ's Light. For the Christian lives in the sure and certain hope of the victory of Christ over all suffering and pain and yes, even over death itself. We Christians share the victory of Christ through the waters of our baptism for as St. Paul states - having died with Christ we shall also live with Christ.

THE WOOD OF THE MANGER SHALL BECOME THE WOOD OF THE CROSS. In that mystery of Christ's death and Resurrection is the cause of our joy and the reason for our hope.




