Not to be with you is indeed a cross - one I must accept in order to continue to serve you as pastor for many (hopefully) years to come.

I am told that after this period of rest - and with ongoing medical attention I should be back to normal (whatever that is!) very soon.

Finally, let me encourage you to make every effort to make this week holy - celebrate the solemn liturgies, take time for prayer; read the scripture; do works of charity and kindness. Please consult the bulletin for the Holy Week and Easter Schedule.

Although not physically with you I will be with you in prayer and united to you in love. God bless.


GOOD NEWS ---






