FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. TOSI ---

And He was transfigured before them and his clothes became dazzling white... Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him."

(Mark 9:2-10)



On this Second Sunday of Lent the church each year relates the event of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Today the church wants us to focus on the goal not only of Lent but of the life of every Christian - the Glory of Heaven. The Cross - its suffering and humiliation - and the Passion predicted by Jesus is not the end for which we long. NO, rather, the wood of the Cross is the means by which we are saved and so share the glory of Jesus' transfiguration. As St. Paul tells us if we have united ourselves to Christ in death we shall be united to Christ in newness of life.

And in order to unite ourselves to Christ we must heed the words spoken from the cloud: "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him." In this communication age we have so many devices to help us "keep in touch". We have become good talkers - but what about listening? Sometimes I 'm so busy talking to God; telling Him my problems and suggesting what He said do that I leave so little time for God to speak to me. Yet, isn't communication a two way street? Do you know someone who constantly talks to you but gives you little opportunity to talk with him/her? Are we that type of person toward God?

Perhaps this Lent we can accept the discipline of listening - to God and to others. Do I mean listening for a voice from heaven out of a cloud? No. God speaks to us in far more ordinary ways, things and yes, even people. If only we listen.

Try it - you might like it! God bless
