Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Saint Luke Church, Whitestone, N.Y.



But he answered him,
"Let the dead bury their dead"--To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow
and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."
(Luke 9:51-62)

These words of Jesus in response to the two men in today's Gospel may seem rather harsh and demanding. The request of each man ("Lord, let me go first and bury my father"; "first let me say farewell to my family at home") seems fair and not unrealistic. Yet the Gospel story focuses our attention on the cost of discipleship.

Such reflection on discipleship seems most appropriate this weekend as Bishop DiMarzio ordains three men to the priesthood for service in the church of Brooklyn and Queens. Please keep these new priests in your prayers - Father Michael Bruno, Father Alonzo Cox and Father Nixon Francois. They were ordained on Saturday, June 26 at 11:00AM in the Cathedral Basilica of Saint James in Downtown Brooklyn. Pray that they will accept both the privilege and the responsibilities of priesthood as they begin their priestly ministry. Priesthood is a wonderful life for those called by God. Yet, there is a cost to this discipleship - a willingness to do God's will and not their own. Priests are called to holiness and mission. Pray that our new priests will be generous in service, alive in faith and overflowing in love.

Yet - the call to discipleship - to holiness and mission - is not a call given to priests alone. The call to discipleship is a common call to all who have received baptism. It is a call lived out in a particular vocation - marriage, priesthood, single state and religious life. Each is unique; each has special graces. Yet all share a common call to holiness and mission. And each shares the cost of being a disciple.

However, the reward for faithful discipleship is great - joy in this life lived in union with the Lord and within the family of the church; hope in the promise of eternal life. May we respond "Yes" to the Lord's call - every day.







REPAIR & MAINTENANCE NEWS ---

- The Sanctuary carpet is in need of attention; after years of use it is time to replace it. Rather than a new carpet, the oak parquet floor under it will be restored and polished. The necessary restoration work will take place the week (Monday-Friday) of July 26th through 30th. During that time all Masses will be celebrated in the School Hall. Funeral Masses will be celebrated in the Hall as well or at Holy Trinity Church by one of the priests from Saint Luke. We are grateful to Fr. Joseph Gibino, pastor of Holy Trinity for his gracious welcome.
- Church Parking Lot --- Work on the parking lot should begin by the end of June. The project will require that the lot be closed to all vehicles during construction. An estimated time frame for completion of the project is two to 3 months. We are sorry for any inconvenience. Parishioners will be asked to park in the schoolyard.
- Stained Glass Windows --- In a letter dated June 4, 2010, Bishop DiMarzio has granted permission for the restoration of the stained glass windows in the church. Having received the Bishop's permission we can now move forward with the project. We are grateful to the Bishop for his approval.

We will continue to keep you informed on these projects as additional details become known. We are grateful to our parishioners. It is only because of your generosity, goodness and love of the parish that we can accomplish so much in maintaining and improving our parish grounds and buildings.

NEW WINDOWS IN THE RECTORY ---

This was much needed as they leaked badly every time it rained; these windows were originals so we got our money's worth out of them! The new windows with labor cost \$4,000. The work included removal of the rotted windows; installation of Anderson replacement wood windows; new windows stained and varnished; exterior of the windows to be capped with bronze aluminum and all necessary pointing of brick work.


