



As the church in the English speaking world awaits the arrival of the New Roman Missal - Third Typical Edition on the first Sunday of Advent, November 27, 2011, one of the changes to the Mass texts most affected is the Memorial Acclamation after the Consecration of the Bread and Wine.

At present the priest announces: "*Let us Proclaim the Mystery of Faith.*" The people respond with one of four possible acclamations. In the New Missal the priest's introduction changes as well as the response options of the people which now will be one of three matching the three options in the Latin. The fourth - and perhaps most used ("*Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again*") will no longer be used. Why?

If you look at the acclamations presently used all but one is addressed to Christ. Which one? You're right! "*Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come again*" does not address Christ and is more of a proclamation than an acclamation. An acclamation is addressed to someone; a proclamation is made about someone.

In the New Missal the Memorial Acclamation will look like this:

Priest: The mystery of faith.

People: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

or

People: When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.

or

People: Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

Why the change to the priest's introduction? The present introduction is more than what appears in the Latin text. And so the new translation is closer to the Latin. In addition the new introduction is similar in structure to what is used in other parts of the Mass: "*The Word of the Lord*"; "*The Gospel of the Lord*"; "*The Body of Christ*"; "*The Blood of Christ*" - "*The Mystery of Faith!*" Likewise, the new directive for the priest indicated that the priest does not join in the response which response belongs to the people. "*Let us*" then no longer expresses the new directive for the priest.

As in the present Missal the Memorial Acclamation is encouraged to be sung especially on Sundays or whenever music is used at Mass.

As the New Roman Missal is introduced and becomes the prayer book of the church gathered at Mass it will take time and patience as we again learn new prayers for a changeless gift of Jesus to His church.




MISSION STATEMENT

## **SECOND IN THE SERIES --**

### **Evangelization and Strategic Planning**

“Go and Make Disciples of All Nations” Matt 28:19. This last charge of Christ in Matthew’s Gospel, just at the moment of his Ascension is the guiding mandate of the Church. We are called in each time and age to reach out and call others to be disciples of Christ. All efforts of Church life are evaluated in light of this primary mission of evangelization.

In our current time, the diocese is in the midst of a strategic planning process. This process is not a deviation from our primary mission given to us by Christ, but it is the necessary and appropriate conversation that we must engage now for the sake of evangelization. This may not be immediately apparent since much of the conversation within the process is about finances, revenue and expenses, rents and leases, debts and capital improvements. One could get a sense that this conversation sounds more like a business meeting than a faith sharing group or an evangelization program.

While our Church is certainly not a business, it is an institution. In order to facilitate the transmission of the Gospel message through divine worship, faith formation and service our fathers and mothers in faith built strong institutions meant to last for many centuries. These institutions require fiscal discipline and prudent planning by competent leaders to insure that they are maintained. If not, they teeter and slowly begin to hold back a faith community from growing instead of facilitating its growth.



The strategic planning process seeks to evaluate and address the real challenge of maintaining our institutions and fostering the growth of our faith communities at the same time. By its nature, this conversation is one of finances, staffing, resources and real estate, but at its heart it is a conversation on evangelization and how we are to continue our primary mission as Catholics.


In the long run the maintenance of these institutions is only important and necessary to the extent that they assist us in living out the mission given to us. As it has been said, “It is not the church that has a mission, but the mission that has a church.” As the process goes forward, there may be some changes in our structures, a reduction of our institutions, changes in personnel, a general tightening of our belts, but our essential mission to evangelize never changes. Evangelization, ministry, service to God’s people both now and into the future, is the test of our efforts and the goal of our plans.

Strategic Planning is focusing on temporal and financial issues, but not to the detriment of our pastoral mission. As responsible stewards of the finite resources that are given to us, we are charged with having this conversation and implementing these necessary changes. In so doing, we are serving the Gospel, honoring our ancestors in faith and ensuring that the Church will be around for many centuries to come to proclaim the saving message of the Gospel to all generations.
