In order to keep the intentions up to date your cooperation is needed:


- If you wish to include a name in our "Book of Prayer", please give the Rectory a call.

So --- We need your help:


- Please continue to fulfill your pledges to the Appeal over the summer months. This is so important!

Are you an adult who has never been baptized?

Are you baptized in another Christian denomination and interested in membership in becoming a Catholic?

Are you baptized Catholic who has not received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation?

If you answer yes to any of these questions, you may want to consider becoming part of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). This is a gradual process by which a person enters the life of the Church. It entails study, faith sharing, Scripture reflection, and rites (steps along the way, celebrated with the faith community).

This process or faith journey begins with a period of inquiry. We invite you to come and explore!
