On the occasion of the start of the special "Year for Priests" the Holy Father addressed a letter to all the priests of the world in celebration of the 150th Anniversary of St. John Vianney also known as the Cure' of Ars, the patron saint of parish priests worldwide.

In his letter Pope Benedict XVI quoted often from the writing of Saint John Vianney. The bulletin today contains one such reference. In response to the saint's words the Holy Father wrote: "These words, welling up from the priestly heart of the holy pastor, might sound excessive. Yet they reveal the high esteem in which he held the sacrament of the priesthood." Excessive perhaps, but a high esteem St. John Vianney sought to live in his total devotion to the Lord and to the people entrusted to his care. The village of Ars of which he was pastor had 230 people. Yet the goodness and holiness of the Cure' of Ars spread throughout France and indeed the entire world.

There are many good, faithful and holy priests within the church today who strive to live lives of service and love in what is often difficult and challenging times. Yet we know of the sadness caused by some priests. As the Holy Father writes in his letter: "there are also, sad to say, situations which can never be sufficiently deplored where the Church herself suffers as a consequence of infidelity on the part of some of her ministers." Pope Benedict challenges all the church's priests to a renewal of their priestly vocation in the image of Jesus Christ. It is a life long journey shared by all the church's members as we strive to live our vocation faithful to our calling - priests, laity or religious.

During this "Year for Priests" pray for priests especially those who have served you and been an instrument of God's love, grace and mercy for you. A question - do you know the name of the priest who baptized you; gave you First Communion and Penance; officiated at your wedding? If you do - pray for them by name; if not - find out who they are and keep them in your prayers. They need your affirmation and love; they are human and in need of your support and encouragement.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS RCIA




Are you an adult who has never been baptized? Are you baptized in another Christian denomination and interested in membership in becoming a Catholic?

Having reached the parish goal of \$93,701 all gifts over goal come directly back to the parish. This depends on each of us fulfilling our promised gift.



SUMMARY OF THE JUNE MEETING OF THE ST. LUKE PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

The meeting opened with a prayer and brief reflection prepared by the Spiritual Enrichment Team.

Bob Choiniere, from the Diocesan Office of Pastoral Planning was present for the purpose of clarifying the role of committees in implementing parish goals. Bob explained that the description of such committees remains purposefully vague, since each parish and PPC operates differently. He went on to say that committees can be formed either from existing leadership or new leadership, and that such leadership is subject to change as it grows and develops.

In light of Bob's presentation, the council decided to step back and look once again at our objectives, before moving ahead with the establishment of committees.

In his Pastor's Report, Monsignor Tosi announced that he has requested all parish groups, with the exception of AA to suspend meeting for the summer months. There will also be no First Friday Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament during July and August.

The Sunday Mass schedule will remain unchanged for the summer. Father Coffey and Father Rene will help out when Monsignor Tosi, Father Dave and Father Vincent are on vacation.

Graduation for St. Luke School is scheduled for Friday, June 12.

Planning for the 100 Anniversary of our school is underway.

Our next meeting will take place on Tuesday, September 15.

What Faith-Based Organizations Need to Know

In 2010, the U.S. census will define who we are as a nation. Taken every 10 years, the census affects political representation and directs the allocation of billions of dollars in government funding. As a faith-based organization, you are dedicated to serving the best interests of your community. Many community members—including those who are isolated by language or geography—look to their faith-based leaders as trusted sources of information. You can partner with the U.S. Census Bureau to convey the importance of participating in the next census and to ensure no one is left uncounted. **Achieving a complete and accurate 2010 Census is in our hands.**

The Census: A Snapshot

- ▲ The U.S. Constitution requires a national census once every 10 years.
- The census is a count of everyone residing in the United States: in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and American Samoa. This includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, both citizens and non-citizens.
- The 2010 Census will create hundreds of thousands of temporary jobs across the nation.

It's in Our Hands: Your Participation in the 2010 Census Matters

- Every year, more than \$300 billion in federal funds are awarded to states and communities based on census data. That's more than \$3 trillion over a 10-year period.
- Census data help faith-based groups plan for new buildings and programs and guide local decision-makers in important community planning efforts, including where to build new roads, hospitals and schools.
- Census data affect your voice in Congress by determining how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Completing the 2010 Census Questionnaire: Simple and Safe

- The 2010 Census questionnaire asks only a few simple questions of each person—name, relationship, gender, age and date of birth, race, and whether the respondent owns or rents his or her home. This simple, short questionnaire takes just a few minutes to complete and return by mail.
- The Census Bureau does not release or share information that identifies individual respondents or their household for 72 years.

2010 CENSUS: Frequently Asked Questions

Why should members of faith-based organizations participate in the 2010 Census? Census data shape the future of your community and define your voice in Congress.

- Census information is used to allocate billions of dollars in government funding for important community facilities that your congregation relies upon, such as schools, roads, hospitals, child-care centers and more.
- Congregations utilize census data as a source of key statistical information needed to determine locations for new facilities and to secure faith-based grants.
- The census determines how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives as well as the boundaries of legislative districts.

How will the 2010 Census differ from previous census efforts?

In the last census, one in six households received a long questionnaire asking for detailed socioeconomic information. In 2010, every residence will receive a short questionnaire that is simple and fast to complete and return. More detailed information will be collected annually from a small percentage of the population through the American Community Survey.

Will the information the Census Bureau collects remain confidential?

Yes. Every Census Bureau worker takes an oath for life to protect the confidentiality of census responses. Violation would result in a jail term of up to five years and/or fine of up to \$250,000. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share an individual's answers with anyone, including welfare and immigration agencies.

Why are faith-based organizations important to the 2010 Census campaign?

More than 140,000 organizations supported Census 2000, including faith-based organizations, state and local governments, community-based organizations, schools, media, businesses and others. Through partnerships, the Census Bureau has a far greater chance to reach every U.S. resident than by attempting this monumental task alone. Communities look to their faith-based leaders, youth groups and lay ministries for guidance and trusted information. You can include census information in newsletters, bulletins and mailings, help recruit members of your community for census jobs and provide space for census activities.

2010 Census Timeline: Key Dates

Fall 2008	Recruitment begins for local census jobs for early census operations.
Spring 2009	Census employees go door-to-door to update address list nationwide.
Fall 2009	Recruitment begins for census takers needed for peak workload in 2010.
February - March 2010	Census questionnaires are mailed or delivered to households.
April 1, 2010	Census Day
April - July 2010	Census takers visit households that did not return a questionnaire by mail.
December 2010	By law, Census Bureau delivers population counts to President for apportionment
March 2011	By law, Census Bureau completes delivery of redistricting data to states.
