

A picture is worth a thousand words

As I watch the new stained glass windows being placed in our church, I am reminded of a trip I took once to the town of Chartres in France, some 50 miles outside of Paris. While there, my friends and I visited the Cathedral of Our Lady of Chartres, a gothic cathedral famous for its stained glass windows and statuary.

We were able to take a guided tour of the cathedral, during which our guide explained to us that everything within the cathedral had a purpose. During the time the cathedral was constructed, many of the people of the town were illiterate and so were not able to read the stories of their faith in the Bible. Thus, the cathedral, as all gothic cathedrals, was constructed in such a way as to expose all who entered to the stories and history of the Christian faith. The sheer immensity of the cathedral, which draws one's vision immediately upward, allows the visitor to be mindful of the grandeur and power of God. The statuary, both interior and exterior, present images of events both from the Scriptures and the lives of the Saints, who provide an example of Christian living. Perhaps most beautiful, the stained glass windows of the cathedral, which present the life of Christ and His saints in shimmering light and color. Even those who could not read could learn their faith and be supported in their efforts to live the Gospel merely by drinking in all that surrounded them in the Cathedral of Our Lady.

The new, beautiful stained glass windows being placed here continue to teach us of the Gospel message of our patron, St. Luke, who shows us the loving compassion of our Savior, especially for the poor. They continue to inspire us as we seek to strengthen our commitment to the gospel which Luke preached. These new windows remind me that every church, not only great cathedrals, is more than simple a brick and stone structure. Rather, every church is a living, dynamic repository which does more than simply hold worshipers. St. Luke's, and every church, proclaims the Scriptures and Christian Tradition in the very bricks, stone, and glass which comprise it.
