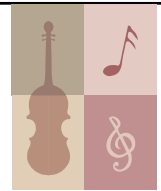


From the Desk of Jessica Tranzillo Smith ---

Occasionally someone will tell me that they thought they didn’t know a hymn only to discover that in fact the tune was a familiar one. If we examine a hymn we can find the reason for this and some very interesting facts about the hymns themselves.

Number 608, “Sing with all the Saints in Glory” is a very popular hymn. If we look to the right of the title we see the name of the tune: *Ode to Joy*. The music of every hymn has a name that identifies it separately from the title. You will note that numbers 176, 562 and 564 have the same Tune Name, although the hymn titles differ. The music is the same for all four hymns.

Also, the text of every hymn can be identified by its poetic meter. If we look at the end of #608 we notice that *Ode to Joy* has the meter 87 87D. This means that the first phrase has 8 syllables, the second has 7, the third has 8 and the fourth has 7 and this pattern is doubled (D). What it also means is that if we find another text with the same meter, those words will fit with the tune of *Ode to Joy*. Coincidentally, the hymn “Love Divine, All Loves Excelling” (Tune name: Hyfrydol) also has the meter 87 87D. The texts for these two hymns are interchangeable.

Very often if I find a hymn with a text appropriate to a particular Sunday and the tune is unfamiliar, I will change the tune to one with which we are more familiar. On June 27, the tune of “Lord you give the great commission” (Abbot’s Leigh 87 87D) was unfamiliar to us so I used the tune *Ode to Joy* with this text to facilitate singing.

The information at the end of a hymn also gives us clues as to how the music and text should be sung by indicating when and where it was written and by whom. In the case of “Sing with all the Saints”, we see that the text is based on Corinthians and penned by William Irons who lived from 1812-1892. The music was written by Ludwig van Beethoven who lived around the same time.

Most of our contemporary songs do not follow this pattern. Their tunes are irregular and their meters are uneven. These songs cannot use any texts except those given them by the composer.

If you examine some of the other hymns in our book, you will find that there are many things to discover about them.

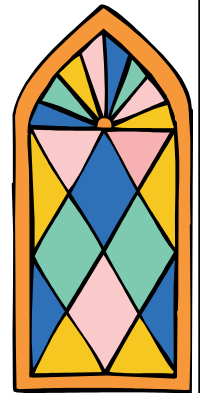

Stained Glass Windows ---

As work progresses on the restoration of the beautiful windows of the church we have the opportunity to create and install new stained glass windows centered on the miracles and parables found only in the Gospel of our parish patron St. Luke. These new stained glass windows would replace the colored glass in the transept windows.



Such windows might include stained glass windows of the Parable of the Prodigal Son, Good Samaritan, Pharisee and Publican, Barren Fig Tree among others or the miracles of the cleansing of the ten lepers; raising of the widow's son at Nain; the miraculous catch of fish among others.

Such windows would bring to life the Gospel of Luke while adding beauty to the church. Other themes are also a possibility.

Following a tradition often found in stained glass, each window would include the name of the donor and/or person in whose memory it is given.

JUST A REMINDER ---

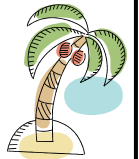
