Today is Catechetical Sunday - which gives us the opportunity to recognize the great work being done by our Religious Education Program under the direction of Sister Katherine Burke, C.S.J. and her many catechists and volunteers. Nearly 500 young people come each week to learn about the Catholic faith and deepening their relationship to Christ. Opportunities for spiritual growth are provided and time for prayer is included. On this Catechetical Sunday the church will bless the catechists in their important ministry.

Working together the school and religious education program minister in so many ways to the young people entrusted to our care helping them to grow in mind, body and spirit faithful to the teachings of Jesus.

I am most grateful to all who work with and minister to the young people of the parish. Please join me in keeping them in our prayers.

SAVE THE DATE ---

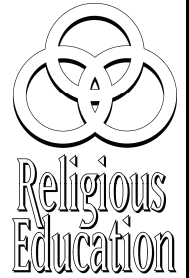

Families who have registered for the program will receive a mailing with the calendar and admittance cards.



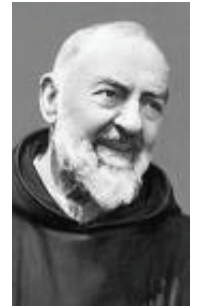

What a wonderful, joyous day Wednesday, September 7 was! Despite the cloudy, rain threatening skies, St. Luke School opened its doors to greet the student body as they gathered outside to meet their teachers. Although it's always a bit sad to say goodbye to the carefree days of summer, the children were all smiles as they greeted their friends. Our school has come alive again with the happy voices of children as they walk through the halls. The faculty and staff welcomed their new classes and are glad to have them back.

Our summer was very busy as we prepared for the 2011-2012 school year. In addition to the top to bottom cleaning of the entire school—walls, floors, rugs, desks, etc. and the general repairs handled by our experienced custodians, we undertook some major remodeling tasks.

As our school population is growing, we are in need of more classroom space. The storage area in the Little Gym was renovated and now houses the new offices of Sister Katherine Burke, the Director of Religious Education, freeing up the classroom on the second floor of the South Wing that was previously used. A new storage closet was built in the cafeteria, and a wall was erected in the Science Lab on the second floor in order to give us space for a Learning Center.


Thanks to the generosity of many of our school parents who volunteered their time, treasures and talents, much was accomplished during the summer months. Mr. Robert McDonagh, owner of RMD Floors, re-finished the beautiful wood floors in our two Pre Kindergarten classrooms. Under the direction of Mrs. Christine Ventura, the school library was painted, with thanks to Michael McCutchen of Triton Finishes and new molding was added and the shelves were sanded and stained thanks to the generosity of Mr. Antonio Bartolotta, owner of A.V.L. Contracting and Woodworking, inc. We are patiently awaiting the installation of a SmartBoard and LCD Projector, kindly donated by Mr. John Haugh. Mrs. Ventura and many of our moms and former graduates were very busy throughout the last two months cataloging all of the books in the library and entering them into automated library database—a monumental undertaking! Mr. Lauro Vazquez applied posters to the sliding closet doors, making the room inviting for all. Some of the classes have already taken a peek at the new space and their oohs and aahs were priceless! They can't wait to come to Library Class!

New to St. Luke's this year, and as a result of requests for registration, another five day Nursery School Class was added. We now have three Nursery School classes with full registration in addition to our two full Pre Kindergarten classes. We have also opened up additional Tiny Tots sessions for our bubbly two year olds. It is very gratifying to all of us here to see our school continue to grow and prosper.

We are extremely grateful for the help and support of our parents. And we thank them for entrusting their children to our care. We take our responsibility for their education – academically, spiritually, emotionally and physically – very seriously. We all have one important goal: to provide our children with an education devoted to academic excellence and committed to Catholic values and ideals.


Warmest greetings in the Lord Jesus!

We are most deeply grateful for the very generous donation of socks that LAMP Ministries recently received from you, who are Disciples in Mission. You are so kind to remember the poor at this time of year. The day before yesterday I asked the LAMP Missionary, who coordinates LAMP's canteen street outreach, if she gets any requests for socks in this kind of weather. Her response was: "Almost every day!"

This is the beginning of the season when we have very many people come to the LAMPcafé. We go out four days a week, for an hour-at midday. We will have an average of 80 - 120 people come in that hour, to receive a sandwich, drink, granola bar, some religious materials, we well as personal sharing and prayers with them as they express their needs. The socks are an added bonus. We, and they, are very grateful. Thank you so much.
