Since becoming pastor many parishioners have spoken to me of their concern about the poor and dangerous condition of the parking lot across from the church and the possibility of making much needed repairs and improvements. While I agreed that the parking lot is in deplorable condition, such a project has not been possible due to limited resources and other parish priorities.

I am pleased to inform you that a long term process is at the point that we hopefully will begin work on a complete renovation of the parking lot across from the church in the near future.

After consultation with both the Parish Pastoral Council and Finance Council and with the involvement of the appropriate city and diocesan offices and the permission of Bishop DiMarzio, a "Purchase and Sale Agreement" has been signed between Saint Luke Church and Mr. Giuseppe Zuccarello, owner of Queens Garden Nursery.

This agreement will involve the sale of a small strip of land to provide a corridor for access to the Nursery. In return Mr. Zuccarello will fund the restoration and improvement of the parking lot without any cost to the parish.

Plans for this restoration have been drawn up by Anthony S. DiProperzio, AIA, Architect who will oversee the work as it progresses.

In addition to the physical improvements - new drainage system; grading and paving; new fence and lighting; complete landscaping and a capacity for approximately 80 cars, this project will provide access to the Nursery so that the many commercial vehicles and trucks will no longer use church property.

I wish to express my thanks to Mr. Zuccarello's son, Louie for his cooperation and commitment in this project which provides the possibility to achieve this much needed parish improvement.

As required by N.Y. State law for religious corporations we are now awaiting the approval of this sale agreement by the New York State Supreme Court. Once approval is given work will begin. Of course, I will keep the parishioners informed on the status of this work as we move forward.

I am grateful that we can address this issue with a mutually beneficial agreement. I know other projects need to be addressed - like the parking lot across from the school. Hopefully, working together we can continue our improvement of our parish buildings and grounds.

NEW INITIATIVE TO SUPPORT CATHOLIC EDUCATION ---

Begins this year with the creation by Bishop DiMarzio of the Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Trust Fund. The fund is designed to give direct aid to every Catholic elementary school and academy located in Brooklyn and Queens. The Trust will be funded by a tax on each parish of the diocese based on the parish weekly collection and/or rental of church property. The total bill for 2009/2010 to the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Trust from St. Luke parish has been set at \$12,500 to be paid in three equal payments of \$4,167 on November 15, 2009, January 15 2010 and March 15, 2010.

Your financial support will enable us to answer this new initiative from our Bishop. Thank you.

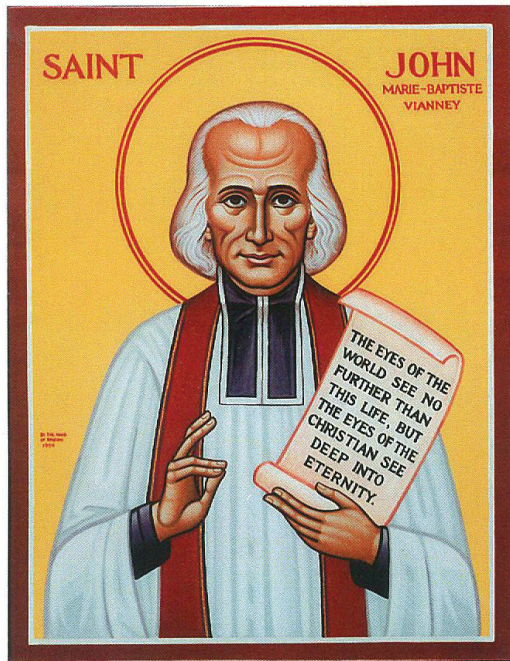

PARISH SUPPORT PROGRAM ---

Thank you for your understanding and encouragement in response to my talk last week-end on the purpose and need for your support of an increase to your weekly offering to the church.

I have asked two parishioners to share a brief reflection about the importance of participation in the Parish Support Program:

As facilitator of the St. Luke's Parish Pastoral Council I write this to comment on the New Support program announced last Sunday by Msgr. Tosi as per diocesan directive.

The Parish Support Program is to help each parish in the diocese to increase funds on a weekly basis so they can pay their monthly bills and enable them to keep the parish and parish ministries alive and growing without incurring a deficit.

As you are all aware the parish relies on the weekly offering to cover the many bills it has to keep St. Luke's alive. We are very much alive.

We do not get any assistance from the diocese in obtaining funds to cover bills. The Parish needs to pay electric, heat, air-conditioning, insurance and maintenance repairs to only name a few.

The Parish Council meets monthly with Msgr. Tosi and is updated on the status of St. Luke's. The reality is that we are not receiving enough funds weekly and are falling short on paying the bills of the parish. The amounts received and amounts needed are published weekly in the bulletin. As it stands currently we are running a deficit on a weekly basis.

We the parishioners of St. Luke's must bond together and make sure that our parish and GOD'S church remains vibrant and continues to grow.

Therefore on behalf of the Parish Pastoral Council we ask that YOU, parishioners, the strength of St. Luke, seriously consider this program and if at all possible increase your weekly offering. Any amount is appreciated and this great Parish of St. Luke's will continue with your help and support.
